The Main Campus is only a short walk from the Conference Centre, the quickest route is marked with heavy arrows on the same map. You do not require a parking permit.

Smoking: In the interest of health and safety, the University has adopted a policy of "no smoking" throughout all University buildings. Visitors are requested to comply with this policy.


Sports and other Facilities: You are invited to use the squash courts at Glen Eyre Hall of residence, but you must bring your own equipment. There is also a TV room and launderette.




CONFERENCE SERVICES
