Dr Kyle Grayson – BISA Honorary Secretary and Conference Chair Newcastle University

Kyle Grayson (PhD York University, Canada) is a Reader in security, politics, and culture at Newcastle University and Honorary Secretary of BISA. He is formerly an editor-in-chief of the journal Politics and currently is associate editor of Critical Studies on Security and co-editor of the Popular Culture and World Politics book series (Routledge). Kyle joined the BISA Board of Trustees as a co-opted member in 2016 and has since become the Honorary Secretary, a role with responsibilities to represent the interests of members, be the 'conscience' of the Association, and serve as the annual conference programme chair.

Professor Mark Webber – BISA Chair

University of Birmingham

Mark Webber is Professor of International Politics at the University of Birmingham. Formerly the Head of the Department of Politics, History and International Relations at Loughborough University, he has been the Head of the School of Government and Society at Birmingham since 2011. He is a NATO specialist and a one-time scholar of Russia and the former Soviet Union. Recent work in these areas has been published in International Affairs, European Journal of International Security, Review of International Studies, European Security, West European Politics, and Journal of European Integration. He is co-editor (with Adrian Hyde-Price) of Theorising NATO: New Perspectives on the Transatlantic Alliance (Routledge 2016) and is currently completing a co-authored book (with James Sperling and Martin Smith) entitled What's Wrong with NATO and How to Fix It. He is also co-editing (with James Sperling) the (Oxford) Handbook on the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation.

Professor Ruth Blakeley – BISA Vice Chair

University of Sheffield

Ruth Blakeley is Professor of Politics and International Relations at the University of Sheffield. She is Director of the ESRC White Rose Social Sciences Doctoral Training Partnership. Her research interests are in international security, terrorism and political violence, and human rights. Her research on the CIA's Rendition, Detention and Interrogation programme has had considerable impact, through litigation on behalf of torture victims at the European Court of Human Rights, and through various police and government level investigations into the role of the UK's intelligence and security services. He is also an Associate Researcher at King's Centre for Science & Security Studies (CSSS) and a member of the Observatory of European Foreign Policy, an international research group based in Barcelona, Spain. Dr Kienzle studies international security co-operation and is particularly interested in the control of nuclear weapons, European defence and 'Brexit'.

Ross Bellaby is a Senior Lecturer in Security Studies at the University of Sheffield's Politics Department. His research focuses on designing ethical frameworks for the intelligence community and for cyber-activity. His ethical framework is set out in his book, The Ethics of Intelligence: A New Framework (2014). This work is further developed in papers on counter-terrorism and the CIA's extraordinary rendition program (2017), the justifiability of cyber-intelligence (2017), the ethical obligation of whistleblowing (2017), and the need for more dark web technology to protect against state surveillance (2018).

Aberystwyth University

Richard Beardsworth is the E.H. Carr Chair in International Politics, Head of the Department of International Politics at Aberystwyth University, UK, and Research Associate at the Institut des Etudes Politiques (SciPo), Paris. His interests lie in international and political theories, in statecraft and global politics. His recent publications (articles, book chapters, essays) rehearse a Weberian and republican account of ethical responsibility towards global challenges that re-aligns national and global interests and duties. His co-edited book (with G. W. Brown and R. Shapcott) The State and Cosmopolitan Responsibility comes out later this year with Oxford University Press. He is presently writing a manuscript on Political Responsibility and Leadership in a Globalized, Fragmented Age.

Jon Gorrie is a Trustee and Chair of the Audit Committee of Restless Development, an international development charity focusing on youth leadership and empowerment. He is currently studying anthropology at Oxford Brookes University. 

The Africa and International Studies Working Group brings together a diverse range of scholars working from, and on issues relating to, the African continent. We aim to provide a forum for discussion of substantive issues arising from a range of different dimensions of 'the international' in Africa, including theoretical and conceptual debates about the relationship between the various current foci of the discipline of International Studies and African historicallybased specificities.

Our objective is to encourage and support researchers to explore both the ways in which African states, communities, business and others shape international politics and the theoretical insights about the international that originate in Africa.

The Colonial, Postcolonial and Decolonial Working Group (CPD) is a research community interested in facilitating interrogations of the colonial question across a broad array of approaches, issue areas and debates in International Relations. Our activities in the working group are not delimited by allegiance to any one set of concepts (e.g. neocolonialism), methodological tradition (e.g. postcolonial thought), or ethics (e.g. decoloniality), nor to any particular time period or substantive area of inquiry. Instead, what draws us together as a research community is the positing of the colonial question as fundamental to inquiry. We are especially interested in supporting early career scholars as well as facilitating engagements between academics and third sector organisations.

The purpose of this BISA working group is to provide an international network through which scholars working on terrorism-related subjects can stay in touch, exchange information on areas of common interest, disseminate research findings in a mutually supportive forum, build collaborative links, and promote the study of terrorism and terrorism-related issues in the academy and the wider public. It aims to create and maintain a community of scholars that will function to broaden and deepen the study of terrorism beyond a narrow security-oriented focus. The working group will be committed to the promotion of rigorous and internationally-recognised scholarship, and to the promotion of greater dialogue between critical terrorism scholars and security officials and practitioners, in an effort to widen and deepen the public debate on responses to terrorism. Related to this, there is a genuine need to promote public education of terrorism-related issues so that a better informed citizenry can properly participate in democratic public debate.

The BISA Emotions in Politics and International Relations Working Group aims to promote the study, research and teaching of emotions in politics and international relations. The role of emotions is increasingly being recognised and addressed in both the academic study of politics and contemporary discussions of global crises and policies. The aim of this working group is threefold; a) to provide a constructive and supportive space for the exploration of this field; b) to actively develop and expand this relatively young field; c) to strengthen the UK and international network of scholars working on emotions and, where relevant, to initiate dialogues with interested policymakers and practitioners.

Since this time, the issue of environmental sustainability has become increasingly salient on the international political agenda, as well as within the discipline of Politics and International Relations. The WG continues to foster the exchange of ideas and insights on all aspects of global environmental politics, including sustainable development, desertification, climate change, deforestation. environmental security, the energy-environment nexus, regional and global governance, North-South tensions, transnational environmental movements, IR theory, and environmental ethics and justice. The WG has produced two edited volumes and a special edition of Global Environmental Politics.

Furthermore, as the concept of security has expanded to include new areas of activity (environment, energy, migration, finance, gender, health), it is also our intention to reach new communities of scholars whose work has traditionally been unrelated to European security.

Many group members have a strong interest in British foreign and defence policy but contributions from comparative foreign policy scholars, analysts of other national foreign policies, and theorists interested in foreign policy analysis more broadly are most welcome.

Members of this Working Group also work in policy-related areas, such as human rights, maternity legislation in Europe, and links between UN peacekeepers and the spread of HIV/AIDS.

The Working Group 'International Politics of Migration, Refugees and Diaspora' responds to a growing demand to discuss issues of migration and international politics at BISA. It aims to consolidate discussions within several streams of scholarship, which speak to each other, but are mostly discussed in isolation. The group will incorporate scholarship on how diasporas as non-state actors affect international affairs for democratisation, development, conflict and post- conflict reconstruction, and how sending states exercise their agency to engage diasporas for their own state-building and economic projects. We also seek to understand large-scale refugee population movements, and how such movements speak to issues of human and minority rights, challenges to statehood, and diffusion of ideas across borders. In this, the group welcomes the perspectives of refugees themselves, states, the European Union, UN, and international organisations. We also seek to integrate studies on citizenship and its transnational dimensions, especially regarding dual and multiple citizenship, which underpin the politics of states towards migrants, as well as the transnational activism of migrants, refugees and diasporas as non-state actors. These discussions engage existing scholarship on migrant integration, assimilation, and securitisation, as well as on transnational aspects of migration such as building of transnational projects and spaces.

The purpose of this BISA working group is to bring together scholars and students interested in questioning the way we think and we do IR, be it from a theoretical, epistemological, ontological or methodological



perspective. The group aims to be pluralistic and fosters fruitful dialogue with participants from all areas of international studies. It is centred on developing questions and areas often overlooked, marginalised or taken for granted in the discipline (for instance, our last two workshops focused on problematising 'the local' and 'the international' as categories of analysis, and on accounting for the performativity of academic discourses). Overall, the group is an invitation to push the boundaries of the discipline and decenter ourselves from the way we routinely do IR by being open to approaches from other disciplines be it sociological, regarding the end of domestic/international dichotomy, or philosophical in regards to the status of positivism in IR or how scientific IR can be.

19. INTERNATIONAL STUDIES OF THE MEDITERRANEAN, MIDDLE EAST & ASIA

The BISA Working Group on the International Studies of the Mediterranean, Middle East and Asia (ISMMEA) aims to provide an interdisciplinary forum in which to bring a diverse range of scholars and practitioners together. The group aims to move beyond the hierarchical binary imaginaries of world order as the so-called the 'West' and the 'non-Western' worlds; to critically examine the constitutive role of the bifurcated view of world order on knowledge production, identity and power, and foreign affairs; and, thereon to consider ways of moving towards an alternative and inclusive approach to theorising on the international relations of these regions by drawing epistemologies from postcolonial, poststructuralist, feminist, constructivist and critical theories.

Its core objective is to support and advance conversations about how to 'interpret' world politics in its various manifestations. It seeks to foster methodological debate and innovations in the study of meanings, identities and ideas through various empirical approaches, such as discourse analysis, narrative history and ethnography, and by critically probing the role of theory and concepts in how we interpret an already interpreted world.

The BISA Peacekeeping and Peacebuilding Working Group was established in March 2018 to provide a space for international studies researchers to develop their work on the various aspects of peacekeeping and peacebuilding. Peacekeeping and peacebuilding operations, broadly defined, are interventions of external third-party military, civilian, or police personnel (or any combination of the three) into areas of violent conflict, with the aim of reducing violence and building sustainable models of peace. With this, the working group examines the role of international and regional organisations, initiatives by single states, as well as efforts of non-governmental international organisations, extending across the range of military, police and civilian personnel in field operations. The working group encourages theoretical engagement with the broader concepts taken from international studies that underpin such interventions, the decision-making process behind them, as well as encouraging policy relevant analysis which engages with decision-makers and practitioners in the field

as well as in troop contributing countries (TCCs). We also encourage interaction with different levels of analysis from understanding the experience of those at the receiving end of such interventions, the views of deployed personnel up to the outlook at the strategic-level decision-making processes undertaken by policy elites.

25. POST-STRUCTURAL POLITICS WORKING GROUP (PPWG)

There is a continuing and growing interest in the former Soviet space in both the area of security studies and foreign policy/international relations. While many issues are examined and written about from an 'out of area' perspective (e.g. energy; terrorism; regional security relations), there is a need to focus on cross-linkages between regional and global issues (e.g. Central Asia-Afghanistan-the 'West'; Russia-Ukraine-NATO/EU) in order to bring together disparate expertise in one forum. Valuable expertise on the subject-area can sometimes be lost to area studies, but we believe this energy should be harnessed to broader disciplinary areas of security studies and foreign policy analysis/international politics. BISA represents an opportunity to gain a higher profile for the study of the former Soviet Union (not just Russia) and to position this in the context of the broader field.








This workshop is designed to be conversational and dynamic. Based on a professional development model, a series of engaged and interactive roundtables will consider some key challenges facing contemporary academia from the starting point that that the personal is political. It will be a forum to share experiences across contexts, career stages, disciplines and institutions and to build networks and foster collaborations.

As a reflection of feminist innovation, contemporary criticality and creative academia, the workshop will conclude with a film screening of the Bafta-nominated film Pili and a Q&A session with the film's producer, Professor Sophie Harman.



Re-building Security Relations post-Brexit: Discussing the future UK-EU security relationship and its longterm implications

Tuesday 11th June, 14.00-18.00, Chatham House Organised by the European Security Working Group As we approach the prospect of Brexit, it is now crucial to consider the future long-term security relationship between the UK and the EU, and to shift our focus from disintegration to re-construction. Not only is it important to analyse what kind of security treaty the UK and the EU might be able to sign, including the possible legal and political formats for the new relationship, the timescale to implement new arrangements and potential roadblocks, but it is also relevant to reflect on a number of elements that are likely to shape the future relationship. In particular, what conception of European security could be developed beyond EU instruments and policies? Has the Brexit process eroded mutual trust and, if so, how will it affect the normalisation of security relations? And, what will be the UK's position within this new relationship? In order to kickstart reflections on the re-construction of the UK-EU security relationship, the event will gather gather academic and policy-making communities that have traditionally not engaged with each other, in particular the criminal justice and internal security community and the defence community. Other Internationals: world-making counter-projects beyond the state

Hosted by the Colonial, Postcolonial and Decolonial Working Group

This special plenary session brings together Prof. Gargi Bhattacharyya, Dr Su Lin Lewis, Prof. AbdouMaliq Simone and Prof. Robbie Shilliam who have each pursued vital research into various forms of internationalism which are usually silenced or marginalised by the discipline of IR. The aim of this session is to excavate some of the many forms of internationalism which exist alongside, and in spite of, the international state system. The conversation will reflect on how 'Other Internationals' have been fostered, how some of these have been variously inhibited and broken down, and how some have resisted and been reconstructed, even against the weight of dominant structures. The speakers will therefore consider Indigenous, Black, anti-colonial, feminist, and other forms of internationalism which have been forged in defiance of structural constraints in the global system.

Prof. AbdouMaliq Simone (University of Sheffield, UK) Prof. Simone is an urbanist with positions at the Urban Institute, University of Sheffield; the Max Planck Institute for the Study of Religious and Ethnic Diversity, and Goldsmiths College, among other institutions. Simone's work spans issues of spatial composition the urban Global South, global blackness, and histories of the present for Muslim working classes.

Prof Gargi Bhattacharyya (University of East London, UK) Prof. Bhattacharyya's work within the discipline of sociology has broadly covered racisms, sexualities, and global cultures. Her most recent book, entitled Rethinking Racial Capitalism, maps out global histories of racial expropriation and analyses the bearing these have on the present.

Dr Su Lin Lewis (University of Bristol, UK) Dr Lewis is Senior Lecturer in Modern Global History and her research covers gender, cosmopolitanism, decolonisation, and migration from the late colonial era to the Cold War with a focus on Southeast Asia and port-cities of the Indian Ocean and Pacific Rim. Dr Lewis leads an AHRC-funded collaborative research network on cultural internationalism and the transnational movements of activists (including trade unions and women's groups), literati, and artists in the 1950s across Asia and Africa (http://afroasiannetworks.com/)

Prof. Robbie Shilliam (Johns Hopkins University, US) Prof. Shilliam's extensive body of work has revealed a great deal about the political and intellectual complicities of colonialism and race in the global order. He also co-curated with community intellectuals and elders a series of exhibitions–in Ethiopia, Jamaica and the UK–which brought to light the histories and significance of the Rastafari movement for contemporary politics.


